



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# A Detail Geek's Guide to Microfiber Towels



Microfibers were invented by Japanese textile company Toray in 1970, but the technology wasn't used for cleaning until the late 1980s. The key, as the name suggests, is in the fiber: Each strand is really tiny—100 times finer than

human hair—which allows them to be packed densely on a towel. That creates a lot of surface area to absorb water and pick up dust and dirt. Plus, microfibers have a positive electric charge when dry (you might notice the static cling on your towels), which further helps the towel to pick up and hold dirt. "They tend to trap the dirt in but not allow it to re-scratch the finish," explains professional concours detailer Tim McNair, who ditched old T-shirts and terry cloths for microfibers back in the 1990s.

These days, the little towels are ubiquitous and relatively cheap, but in order to perform wonders consistently, they need to be treated with respect. Below, a miniature guide to microfibers.

#### Care for Your Towels: Dos and Don'ts

"They're just towels," you might say to yourself. But if you want them to last and retain their effectiveness, microfiber towels need more care than your shop rags: **DO:** Keep your microfiber towels together in a clean storage space like a Rubbermaid container. They absorb dirt so readily that a carelessly stored one will be dirty before you even use it.

**DON'T:** Keep towels that are dropped on the ground. It's hard to get that gunk out and it will scratch your paint. **DO:** Reuse your towels. "I have towels that have lasted 15 years," says McNair. That said, he recommends keeping track of how they're used. "I'll use a general-purpose microfiber to clean an interior or two, and I'll take them home and wash them. After about two, three washings, it starts to fade and get funky, and then that becomes the towel that does lower rockers. Then the lower rocker towel becomes the engine towel. After engines, it gets thrown away."

**DON'T:** Wash your microfibers with scented detergent, which can damage the fibers and make them less effective at trapping dirt. OxiClean works great, according to McNair.

**DO:** Separate your microfibers from other laundry. "Make sure that you keep the really good stuff with the really good stuff and the filthy stuff with the filthy stuff," says McNair.

**DO:** Air-dry your towels. Heat from the dryer can damage the delicate fibers. If you're in a rush, use the dryer's lowest setting

The budget pack of microfiber towels will serve you fine, but if you want to go down the detailing rabbit hole, there's a dizzying variety of towel types that will help you do specific jobs more effectively. Here's what McNair recommends:

#### General Use:

German janitorial supply company Unger's towels are "the most durable things I've ever seen," says McNair.

#### Drying:

Towels with a big heavy nap are great for drying a wet car (but not so great for taking off polish).



Griot's Extra-Large Edgeless Drying towel, \$45

#### Polishing:

Larger edgeless towels are good at picking up polishing compound residue without scratching the paint.

# Wheels and other greasy areas:

This roll of 75 microfiber towels from Walmart is perfect for down-and-dirty cleaning, like wire wheels. When your towel gets too dirty, throw it away and rip a new one off the roll.





#### Glass:

There are specific two-sided towels for glass cleaning. One side has a thick nap that is good for getting bugs and gunk off the windshield. The other side has no nap—just a smooth nylon finish—that's good for a streak-free final wipe down.



What's New for 2025? Though it's built on the C8 Corvette chassis, the 2025 ZR1 is crafted with many new and unique components, from its twin-turbo V-8 engine to its advanced aerodynamics. Carbon-ceramic brake rotors—15.7 inches in front, the largest ever fitted to a Corvette—are the product of a new process claimed to reduce operating temps and increase durability. Five new wheel designs—four alloys and one carbon-fiber option—are available, and an available carbon-fiber roof reduces weight. Fresh colors, including Competition Yellow, Hysteria Purple, and Sebring Orange (the last a reissue of the popular C7 Corvette ZR1 hue), make the ZR1's list of available features, as do various full-length body stripes and choice of caliper and seatbelt colors.

The ZR1 coupe and convertible are offered in base 1LZ and premium 3LZ trims. We think the more expensive of the two coupes is worth the upgrade as it comes with heated and ventilated nappa leather seats, a 14-speaker Bose stereo system, and an extended leather treatment on the dashboard and doors. Track rats in search of even more capability will want to investigate the ZTK Performance package, which ramps up the aero downforce with a host of carbon-fiber components and different underbody pieces, stiffens up the suspension, and swaps out the standard rubber for Michelin Pilot Sport Cup 2R tires. Buyers can also spec the carbon aero bits from the ZTK Performance pack for the base ZR1. A \$3000 gas-guzzler tax applies to all Corvette ZR1 models.

Times have changed since Car and Driver dubbed the first ZR1 "the Corvette from hell" back in 1990, but those three characters still carry a heavy burden. The 2025 Corvette C8 ZR1 shoulders that load proficiently with 1064 horsepower emanating from its mid-mounted twin-turbo V-8 and a finely honed chassis. The ZR1 is the first factory turbocharged Corvette in history, and its output figure represents "the most power ever from a factory Corvette and the most powerful V-8 ever produced in America from an auto manufacturer," according to Chevrolet. We'll let you fact-check that, but its output blows away the 755 ponies of the previous Corvette C7 ZR1 (772 with performance exhaust) and even dusts the 1025hp supercharged V-8 in the Dodge Challenger Demon SRT 170. But the Corvette ZR1 has the moves to back up its muscle, combining a standard adaptive suspension, massive brakes, and over 1200 pounds of downforce produced from its most aggressive aerodynamic package to ensure the chassis can make the most of its potent powerplant. Stylistically, it digs deeper into the Corvette legacy, the coupe presenting a carbon-fiber homage to the iconic split-window design of the 1963 Corvette coupe. But you'll need to stick with the coupe to enjoy this feature, as going with the convertible body style forgoes the split-window detail. But really, any similarities to any previous Corvettes are in name only, as the 2025 ZR1 is a fully modern mid-engine beast ready to do battle with the fastest, most expensive supercars in the world.

# Former 1966 Corvette Racer Earns Keith's Choice Award at Corvette Invasion

As one of special guests at this year's Corvette Invasion show held in Bastrop, Texas, I had the privilege of being able to give an award for my favorite Corvette at the show. Despite 350 Corvettes in attendance, I quickly zeroed in my choice early Saturday morning, and it goes to this Black 1966 Corvette Convertible now owned by Eddie Burt Jr.



Eddie's father ordered the Black '66 Corvette Convertible with the Bright Blue interior in October 1965 with the intent to go racing. It came equipped with the 427 V8 which was rated at 450-hp at the time, and it featured the close-ratio 4-speed manual transmission and 4.56:1 gears. Once Eddie Sr. had the car, he hardened up the engine even more with ported heads, roller rocker arms, a bigger camshaft, and a set of Doug Thorley headers. With a four-point rollbar and racing slicks installed, Eddie ran the car in A-Sport Production (A/SP) where it won many races at Shreveport Dragway and surrounding tracks.

Eddie Jr. says the car was already put away by the time he came along, but he remembers playing all over it, when it was first stored on a trailer and then moved to



the garage in 1993.

When it came time to start the process of getting the car back on the road, Eddie says his dad kept just about everything that was originally on the car, sans the hubcaps which got used for decorations at a shop and are now long gone. The Corvette still wears its initial 1966 inspection sticker as his dad never put it back on the road once he started racing it. The odometer currently reads approximately 25,400 original miles, which Eddie Jr. explains that most of those miles were put on the car from it being towed from track to track.

Today the car still retains the many battle scars from its racing career, including the big block hood that once had openings in its bulge and then was glassed over. The rear wheel wells were enlarged for larger tires as the car was turned into a gasser for a few years. Eddie Jr.

says he kept the front bumpers off the car, as that's how his dad raced with it. The car still retains some of the stickers from its racing days including the doors which say "Eddie Burt – Shreveport, LA".

I am pretty sure that Eddie told me this was his very first show with the Corvette, and he had his spot decorated with a


display board featuring some of the newspaper clippings from his father's drag racing days. The family even had some of the original trophies won by his dad which were displayed in front of car.

While talking with Eddie, he refers to the Black 1966 Corvette as being "his dad's Corvette," which is something I can totally relate to as I have my dad's Black 1966 Corvette in my garage. I have now owned it longer than he did, but it will always be "my dad's Corvette."

It was a pleasure and honor to give my Keith's Choice Award for the 2025 Corvette Invasion show to Eddie Burt Jr. and his dad's 1966 Corvette. He was also supported by his sister and another family member which I sadly forget their names. Again, congrats and well done in celebrating this legacy of your dad with you.


