Answer: I am a 1966 Corvette.

What detail defines me as a 66?

- 1. The 1963 thru 1967 (midyear) Corvettes are commonly known as the Corvette Sting Ray. Unlike the race car which spelled Stingray as one word the mid year Corvettes separated the name into two words "Sting Ray". No one knows why. The tell here is the front and rear emblems. Only the 1966 displayed the Sting Ray Corvette badge on both the front and rear, all others displayed this badge on the rear only.
- 2. All midyear Corvettes had the Dual Cowl dash. This design was met with a lot of acclaim, it displayed large round gauges easily read and unobstructed by a deep dish steering wheel. The under dash emergency pull handle was replaced by a center console lever in 1967.
- All midyear Corvettes have hidden headlights. This will remain a signature trait of Corvettes through 2004. The egg crate grill appeared only on the 1966 & 67 Corvettes.
- 4. The single pane rear window was a characteristic of all midyears except the 1963 (aka the split window Corvette).

- 5. The front quarter panel vents were changed from two scoop-like (non-functional) vents to three gill-like (functional) vents in 1965 and then a five-gill array in 1967. The vents on the roof pillar were deleted in 1966.
- 6. Finned aluminum knock-off rims were introduced in 1963, but not available until 1964. They were replaced by a bolt-on look-alike rim in 1967. It is recognizable by its center cap.
- 7. Sidepipes were introduced in 1965 and available on midyears through 1967.
- 8. The 396 cu.in. powerhouse introduced in 1965 was replaced by the 427 cu.in. in 1966.
- 9. The hood scoop (or bulge) indicative of the Chevrolet big block engines (396 & 427 cu.in.) appeared in 1965 and 1966. It was replaced in 1967 by a hood scoop and stinger in 1967.





Even before the eighth-generation Corvette debuted, there were rumors of a bonkers new model named after Zora Arkus-Duntov—the father of the Corvette. The famed Chevrolet engineer envisioned a powerful, mid-engine sports car decades before the C8 arrived. Concept cars through the 1980s and 1990s teased the future, but sadly, Zora wouldn't live to see a production 'Vette with the engine behind the driver. He died in 1996.

Corvette Zora rumors only grew after the 2020 Stingray debuted. We heard wild stuff about prototypes with twisted frames, cracked windows, and electrical systems unable to handle the load. Everything pointed to something with insane power, but those stories could've been about the ZR1. It's been the most powerful Corvette for the past two generations, and this latest version packs 1,064 horsepower. It's the most powerful Chevy ever—but it won't hold that title for long.

Chevrolet hasn't officially confirmed it yet, but there's undeniable evidence that another model above the ZR1 is coming. Here's everything we know so far about the Corvette Zora.

What Will the Corvette Zora Look Like?

At a glance, you probably won't notice any difference between it, the Z06, and the ZR1. The camouflaged prototypes we've seen have similar front and rear fascias, big wings, and the same quad-pipe center exhaust. That's not to say the production model won't have some Zora-specific design cues, but such differences will likely be relegated to small trim items. And Zora badging, of course.

Our rendering attempts to predict the nuanced differences between the Z06 and ZR1, but ultimately, it still looks like a Corvette with a big wing. Not that that's necessarily a bad thing.

Will It Be A Hybrid?

In a word, yes. Rumors have long pointed to Zora having the ZR1's engine paired with the E-Ray's hybrid system. Speaking with Corvette's former Chief Engineer Tadge Juechter at the ZR1 debut, he all but confirmed it by saying the company was "still working on stuff in the future" for the C8. Considering the ZR1 already has 1,064 hp from its twin-turbocharged 5.5-liter V-8, there's little left to do aside from sticking the E-Ray's front-mounted electric motor in there.

Beyond that, we had the opportunity to get an upclose look at the ZR1's construction and noticed some peculiar features. Hoses are shaped in ways to accommodate an electric motor, despite one not being there. The ZR1's center tunnel also has room for the E-Ray's battery pack. The E-Ray uses a different gasoline engine, so ZR1 designers could have changed this up for better packaging. They didn't—which strongly suggests electric assist was the plan all along.

And then we come to the prototypes. Cars with hybrid or electric power trains lapping the Nurburgring must have yellow stickers, and we see them on recent C8 Corvette sightings. Looking closely at the front, we spot the same distinctive radiators used by the E-Ray. It's the proverbial smoking gun for Zora's all-wheel-drive hybrid power train.



How Much Horsepower Will It Have?

Going strictly by current stats for the ZR1 and E-Ray, we get 1,224 combined hp. That's 1,064 from the engine with 160 hp coming from the electric motor, but there's nothing stopping Chevrolet engineers from adding more to the pot. Long standing rumors suggested the ZR1 would have around 850 hp with Zora topping 1,000, so there's a precedent for Chevy coming in with higherthan-expected figures. Does the V-8 have more to give? Can the electric motor draw more juice from the battery? In any case, expect a minimum of 1,224 hp.

How Fast Will It Go?

With the extra weight of an all-wheel drive hybrid powertrain and potential limits to the electric motor, Zora may not outrun ZR1. Considering GM President Mark Reuss recently hit 233 miles per hour in a ZR1, only a few production cars in the world can beat it. That said, we expect the all-wheel-drive Zora to be the quickest accelerating of all Corvettes, trouncing ZR1 off the line. A 0-60 mph time in the low two-second range is likely.



How Much Will It Cost?

The Chevrolet Corvette Zora will be supremely expensive, or a straight-up bargain depending on your point of view. It will be more expensive than the ZR1, which is expected to start somewhere in the \$150,000 to \$180,000 range. It could be way more expensive if Chevy decides to make Zora a limited-production trim like the Ford Mustang GTD. But, it will have legit hypercar performance usually reserved for multi-million-dollar machines like the Mercedes-AMG One. We'd be shocked if Zora cracks \$500,000, making it the hypercar bargain of the century.

When Does It Debut?

Thus far, Chevrolet has followed a debut pattern of roughly two years between trims. If that holds true, expect to see the Zora unveiled late in 2025 or early 2026.

However on Sunday it does not open till 2pm and would mean spending the night there unless you don't mind driving at night.

Big Bend National Park was authorized by Congress in 1935 to preserve and protect a representative area of the Chihuahuan Desert along the Rio Grande for the benefit and enjoyment of present and future generations. The park includes rich biological and geological diversity, cultural history, recreational resources, and outstanding opportunities for bi-national protection of our shared natural and cultural heritage.

The Big Bend area of Texas derives its name from its location on the bend of the Rio Grande. The river ceates a natural border that separates the United States from Mexico. **Big Bend National Park's purpose is threefold:**

Preserve and protect all natural and national registereligible cultural resources and values.

Provide educational opportunities to foster understanding and appreciation of the natural andhuman history of the region.

Provide recreational opportunities for diverse groups that are compatible with the protection and appreciation of park resources.

In 1933, Texas established Texas Canyons State Park using 15 school sections owned by the state. Lands forfeited for non payment of taxes were quickly added and the name was changed to Big Bend State Park, and by October 1933 included about 160,000 acres. On June 20, 1935, President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed a bill that authorized the establishment of Big Bend National Park. On June 6, 1944 a deed for about 700,000 acres was formally presented to President Roosevelt. On June 12, 1944, Big Bend was established as a national park by Congressional Act signed by President

Franklin D. Roosevelt. It was designated an International Biosphere Reserve in 1976.

Park Significance

The park is significant because it contains the most representative example of the Chihuahuan Desert ecosystem in the United States. The park's river, desert, and mountain environments support an extraordinary richness of biological diversity, including endemic plants and animals, and provide unparalleled recreation opportunities. The geologic features and Cretaceous and Tertiary fossils in Big Bend National Park create opportunities to study many sedimentary and igneous processes.

Archeological and historic resources provide examples of cultural interaction in the Big Bend Region and varied ways humans adapted to the desert and river environments. The Rio Grande is life-sustaining for plants, animals, and human inhabitants beyond its banks. Along with three Mexican protected areas, Maderas del Carmen, Cañon de Santa Elena, and Ocampo, Big Bend is now part of one of the largest transboundary protected areas in North America. More than three million acres of Chihuahuan Desert resources, along with more than 200 miles of river, are now under the national protection of the United States and Mexico. Lastly, it was determined that Big Bend's remoteness has created conditions for

Human History
