

#### I am a 1962 Corvette

What detail defines the 1962? All the above.

- The rear Corvette medallion found on Corvettes from 1958 has a black backing in 1962, instead of the customary white or brushed aluminum. The gas filler cap replaces it in 1963.
- 2. 1962 is the last year of the solid axle and the year the 327 cu.in. V-8 was introduced. It offered 230, 245, 270 carbureted and 275 and 315 hp F.I. versions.
- 3. The customary shark tooth front grill (13 tooth in 53 thru 57 and 11 tooth in 58 thru 60) was replaced by a mesh front grill in 1961 & 1962. Unlike the 61 which was bright finish, the 62 is black anodized.
- 4. The 62 crossed flag emblem with the red, white and blue bar is unique to 62.
- 5. The three side spears in the accent cove are replaced by an 18-fin gill. The cove of the 62 is the body color. The two tone paint was no longer an option.
- 6. 1962 was the first year a rocker panel trim was offered. It complemented the cove trim. Even though the side cove was eliminated after 1962, the rocker molding continued (in different forms) through 1983.




