



Legends at the Rangers Game

The Texas Rangers selected Ian Kinsler and John Blake to be inducted into the Rangers Hall of Fame and a pre-game ceremony was planned for Aug 13, 2022.

lan Kinsler was an All Star second baseman for the Rangers from 2006-2013. John Blake was VP of Communications with the Rangers for over 35 years.

The Rangers wanted to do something special for the induction ceremony because it was also the 50th anniversary of the Rangers in Arlington. So, in early August they contacted Gary Williams about getting two early 70's Corvette convertibles to bring the inductees onto the field. Specifically, they wanted '72s. Gary's is a 1972 LT1. Gary contacted me about participating, since I have a 1971 convertible (Close enough). I agreed, so after getting instructions from the Rangers we were set for August 13.

We arrived at the stadium at 3:30 and drove down the ramp to the area below the stadium at the left field entrance. We met with the coordinators for the ceremony and got details for the ceremony. I was to take Ian Kinsler onto the field and Gary was to take John Blake. We were to drop them off at the third base dugout and then wait for the ceremony to complete. After the ceremony we were to drive Ian and John slowly around the perimeter of the field back to the left field exit where we started.

After getting these instructions we both then went to the third base field level lounge and watched warmups until we went back to our cars about 5:15. Shortly thereafter that Ian and John arrived, and we chatted and took pictures until about 6:00.



Bowling Green Assembly Plant Plans to Resume Tours

The National Corvette Museum (NCM) and Bowling Green Assembly are pleased to announce plans to resume plant tours of the only facility in the world where Corvettes are manufactured. Tours will go on sale to the public via the National Corvette Museum's website on Tuesday, November 1, 2022. National Corvette Museum members qualify for early booking access, beginning on Tuesday, October 25, 2022. Tour scheduling will take place at the time of purchase with public tours expected to resume before the end of the year.

In 1981, General Motors moved production of the Chevrolet Corvette from St. Louis, MO to 600 Corvette Drive, Bowling Green, KY. Known as "America's Sports Car," the plant tour allows visitors to watch an icon in the making. The Corvette is the world's longest-running, continuously produced passenger car with more than 1.75 million produced. The GM site consists of 212 acres, and the plant has 1.7 million square feet —equivalent to 39 acres or 29.5 football fields, under roof.

Plant tours were initially suspended in 2017 due to plant enhancements and significant layout changes of the facility. The Covid pandemic further delayed plant tours. "We have been waiting for this day for what feels like an

eternity," said Kai Spande, Plant Director for the General Motors Bowling Green Assembly Plant and Board Chairman of the National Corvette Museum. "It's a great point of pride for our workforce to be able to share what it takes to make America's Sports Car. We cannot wait to start welcoming Corvette customers, enthusiasts, and friends back for tours of our plant."

Kai mentioned that if you participated in an R8C Museum Delivery when plant tours were closed, you will receive a complimentary make-up tour. As Kai said, "We owe you one!" When asked about the new R8C participant's ability to walk the Corvette assembly line and watch their Corvette get built, Kai relayed that those details are not yet determined.

If you are lucky enough to be able to order a Z06, the Build Your Own Engine program for the LT6 starts in the second quarter of 2023. He says that will be a bit different. Participants will stay at one location, and the parts to build the engine will be brought directly to them.

Individuals must be ages 13 and up to participate in a plant tour. Bags, cameras, and open-toe shoes are not permitted inside the building.

Advanced reservations are recommended. Some walk up admission may be available but is not guaranteed day-of tour. For more information on plant tours, visit corvettemuseum.org or subscribe to the NCM newsletter for more updates!
