

### Here's Why The 1967 Chevrolet Corvette L88 Is The Most Expensive Chevy Ever Sold At Auction



For nearly 70 years, the Chevrolet Corvette has been the definitive sports car from America. Originally born as Detroit's answer to the wash of European imports such as the Jaguar XK120, Triumph TR2 and MGA. The Corvette grew out of its straight-six origins and quickly matured into a unique V8-powered beast.

The C1 was a roaring success and as the world moved into the swinging 60s, GM's replacement had to be slicker, quicker and cooler. And boy, did they deliver.

The C2 generation 'Vette is regarded by many as the greatest Corvette model ever made. It thrived through the rise and peak of the muscle car era, with an array of powerful V8s on offer. The styling was inspired by the jet era and no matter which engine you selected, it went like one too.

Corvette enthusiasts are keen to pick out the desirable versions of the C2; from the 1963-only split window coupe, which are very desirable when up for sale, to the Grand Sport, and what many would call the holy grail that is being featured today: The 1967 model with the 427ci V8 - equipped with the L88 package.

Given the actual car pictured sold for nearly \$2.7 million in the Spring of 2021, here is what makes the L88 so special.

### Only 20 Were Ever Made For 1967 -With Half Of Them Estimated To Survive

That's correct. Even though 216 Corvettes were equipped with the L88 package between 1967 and 1969,

just 20 were ever made for 1967 - which was the final model year for the C2 before the C3 replaced it, carrying over the rest of the L88 engines.

One of the reasons for this is because customers anticipated that the C2 would soon be replaced with an updated body style, and so it was hard to justify spending an extra \$1,500 for the L88 option over the price of a regular big block 427. In hindsight, it's fair to say that the C2 generation ended up being the much more desirable car than the replacement C3, though some can look epic when modified.

What's even more baffling is that an estimated half of those are thought to survive today, so around ten. Meaning this car is rarer than a Ferrari 250 GTO, or even an Aston Martin DB4 GT Zagato - a car that we absolutely love.

Rarity only means gold to the collector car market, so naturally when a C2 L88 occasionally comes up for sale, people are naturally going to fight their every last check book to win it on the auction block.

### It Was A Race Car For The Road With All Luxuries Removed

The L88 engine was developed by Robert Penske and Zora Arkus-Duntov — the latter being a former racing driver for Porsche and helped develop the race-orientated Corvette Grand Sport in 1963 which has a very interesting history itself.

The idea of the L88 was that it was designed to be bought as a street car, but could easily be converted for racing purposes. Unlike most other C2s, it did away with creature comforts such as a heater and radio in order to save weight.

It featured the 4-speed 'rock crusher' transmission, as well as heavy-duty suspension and power brakes. The L88 was as close to a racecar for the road that Chevrolet made from the factory at the time. Naturally, some buyers who ticked the L88 option did race them at events including Sebring and the 24h Le Mans — a race that has hosted some iconic victors.

### The Engine's Power Was Vastly Underrated

The big block 427 V8 with the L88 option was advertised by Chevrolet at 430hp. In 1967, this was already an explosive amount compared to every other car at the time. The only other American engines that could keep up on paper were Chrysler's 426 Hemi, powering cars such as the Plymouth Road Runner, and Ford's big block 427 as found in the Shelby Cobra.

However, GM was massively understating the car's power. In reality, ticking the L88 option meant a ballpark figure of 560hp when running on 103-octane race fuel. For the late 1960s, this was a level of power that was practically unheard of. The only other sorts of cars that came close to that were full-blown Le Mans racers.

This gave the L88 the kind of beastly legacy that gave the Corvette its muscle-like image. Though something like the current Mustang is great, this was the peak of the classic muscle car era and that level of power along with the C2's timeless styling meant it was always going to be a desirable beast to those in the know.

### It Was The Most Powerful Factory Corvette Produced Until 2009

That's right, for nearly 40 years or so, there wasn't a more powerful Corvette from the factory than the L88. That 560hp figure was unmatched by any Corvette that succeeded it until one day in 2009 when the C6 ZR1 went on sale - which was quite the tunable beast.

The ZR1 churned out an enormous 640hp from its supercharged 6.2-liter V8, meaning the power crown that the C2 L88 wore for 42 years had finally been stolen.

Of course, in the modern era, the ZR1's figure was quickly swept by the C7 Z06 and 755hp ZR1. Even the European-bashing C8 Z06 has 670hp, so goodness knows what the eventual ZR1 model of that will churn out? But nevertheless, the C2 L88 Vette was so powerful, it held the trophy for an extortionately long time and probably longer than any performance car made today will ever achieve.

### Proposed Changes to the Corvette Legends of Texas Club By Laws

These items will be voted on at the regular meeting on February 11, 2023 at BJ's Brewhouse, Addison

### Changes appear in bold type.

- ARTICLE XII TERM OF OFFICE
- 1. The term of office for officers shall not be limited.
- 2. Partial terms are not counted as part of the full term.
- 3. Each officer shall hold office until the earlier of:
  - a. The election of his/her successor
  - b. Death
  - c. Resignation
  - d. Removal from office in accordance with the Club Operations Policy.

### ARTICLE XII – TERM OF OFFICE PROPOSED CHANGE:

- 1. The term of office for officers shall **be limited to** Four (4) years.
- 2. Partial terms are not counted as part of the full term.
- 3. Each officer shall hold office until the earlier of: a. The election of his/her successor
  - b. Death
  - c. Resignation
  - d. Removal from office in accordance with the Club Operations Policy.

### Proposed Changes to the Corvette Legends of Texas Club Operations Policy

### ARTICLE II- CAR ASSIGNMENTS

- The governing size of the Club membership will be determined by Corvette body style (C-1, C-2, C-3, C-4, C-5, and C-6).
  - a. The number of primary cars registered by Club members shall be limited to 150 in total memberships.
  - b. The numbers of cars will be allocated in the following manner: C-1 (15 cars) cars, C-2 (45 cars), C-3 (45 cars), C-4 (10 cars), C-5 (10 cars), C-6 (10), Specialty-Custom, Racers, Collector Editions, Pace Cars, Grand Sports, Calloway's, etc. (15 cars).

#### ARTICLE II – CAR ASSIGNMENTS PROPOSED CHANGE: ELIMINATE ENTIRELY & RENUMBER ALL ARTICLES THAT FOLLOW

### ARTICLE III- SPECIAL MEETINGS

 Notice of any special meeting of the officers shall be given by the Secretary at least 3 days previously thereto by telephone communication, written notice, delivered personally, sent by mail, or e-mail to each officer at his/her address as shown by the records of the Club.

- a. If notice is given by telephone either direct verbal communication with the officer or notice by answering machine shall be deemed delivered.
- b. If mailed such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail so addressed with postage thereon prepaid.
- c. If notice is given by fax machine, notice shall be deemed delivered when sender's fax machine receives confirmation of sending notice without communication error.
- d. If notice is given by telegram, such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when the telegram is delivered to the telegram company.

### ARTICLE II – SPECIĂL MEETINGS PROPOSED CHANGES

- 1. Notice of any special meeting of the officers shall be given by the Secretary at least 3 days previously thereto by telephone communication, written notice, delivered personally, sent by mail, or e-mail to each officer at his/her address as shown by the records of the Club.
  - a. If notice is given by telephone either direct verbal communication with the officer or notice by answering machine shall be deemed delivered.
  - b. If mailed such notice shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail so addressed with postage thereon prepaid.

### ELIMINATE c. & d. SINCE FAX MACHINES AND TELE-GRAMS ARE NO LONGER USED & RENUMBER ARTICLE TO BE ARTICLE II

### ARTICLE X – ELECTIONS

- 1. Officer elections will be held at the December Club meeting of the election year.
- 2. Officers will be elected by secret ballot.
- 3. An affirmative vote of no less than a majority of cast ballots is required to elect a nominee.
  - Ballots will be distributed to the voting members no later than fourteen (14) days prior to the December Business meeting of the election year.
  - b. The duties of elected officers will commence January 1 of each officer's term.

### ARTICLE IX - ELECTIONS PROPOSED CHANGES

- 1. Officer elections will be held at the December Club meeting of the election year. **Elections will be held every two years.**
- 2. Officers will be elected by secret ballot.
- 3. An affirmative vote of no less than a majority of cast ballots is required to elect a nominee.
  - Ballots will be distributed to the voting members no later than fourteen (14) days prior to the December Business meeting of the election year.
  - b. The duties of elected officers will commence January 1 of each officer's term.


What an incredible year it has been at the National Corvette Museum! While there is much to celebrate






Corvette Mike reports that in 2025 the Corvette name will not just refer to the car

as it will be a sub-brand without the Chevrolet nameplate.

The Corvette Z06 we know and love will be under the new Corvette brand. It will also include an unannounced EV 4-door coupe and a sporty, high-performance EV SUV. That will bring the total number of models under the Corvette Brand to eight (joined by the ZR1, E-Ray hybrid AWD, the fully electric C8, and the Zora).

The hybrid and full EV models will use GM's Ultium platform for enhanced shape, stance, and engineering flexibility. Engineers behind the architecture designed it for a range of model sizes, styles, contouring, and performance capabilities with up to 800V battery pack and 350 kW fast charging capability.


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
